ピュアカム葉酸及びピュアカム葉酸MV **Pyuakamu-yosan and Pyuakamu-yosan MV¹** (A tablet-formed food containing folic acid) (Food for specified health uses)

Food Safety Commission of Japan (FSCJ) February 2016

ABSTRACT

FSCJ conducted a risk assessment of a food for specified health uses (FOSHU), *Pyuakamu-yosan and Pyuakamu-yosan MV* based on the documents submitted by the applicant and "Stance on Safety Assessments of folic acid (pteroylmonoglutamic acid), reduction of disease risk FOSHU". *Pyuakamu-yosan and Pyuakamu-yosan MV* are tablet-formedfood containing folic acid (pteroylmonoglutamic acid) as the ingredient relevant to its specified health use, "may reduce the risk of birth deffects such as spina bifida and other neural tube defects" (labeled with reduction of disease risk claims).

Data used in the assessment include human trials (healthy women) of 12-week continuous consumption and of 4-week continuous 5 fold excessive consumption.

A recommended daily intake of these products, one tablet for *Pyuakamu-yosan*, two tablets for *Pyuakamu-yosan MV* contain 400 μ g of pteroylmonoglutamic acid: folic acid as the ingredient relevant to its specified health use. The contained amount is equal to the lower limit of the recommended daily intake of folic acid prescribed in the labeling approval for the Foods for Specified Health Uses²

Based on the above results and the presented documents, FSCJ concluded that *Pyuakamu-yosan* and *Pyuakamu-yosan MV* have no concern relevant to human health as long as pregnant women and women expected to be pregnant observe the recommended daily dose of the products and take them only before and during the first trimester of pregnancy.
