## **ABSTRACT**

The FSCJ conducted a safety assessment of a food additive, carboxypeptidase produced using JPAo007 strain.

This additive is carboxypeptidase produced using JPAo007 strain which was generated through the introduction of the carboxypeptidase gene derived from *Aspergillus oryzae* IFO4177 strain as a host. This enzyme hydrolyzes the carboxy-terminal end of protein or peptide. It is used for eliminating bitterness and improving flavor during the process of hydrolyzed substances of proteins.

Referring to "Standards for Safety Assessments of Genetically Modified Food Additives produced Using Genetically Modified Microorganisms"<sup>1</sup>, the FSCJ confirmed the following:

- i. the safety of the inserted gene; and
- ii. the toxicity and allergenicity of the protein produced from the inserted gene, and others. Consequently, any new safety concerns were not identified, compared with conventional additives.

The FSCJ concluded that "carboxypeptidase produced using JPAo007 strain" has no concern relevant to human health.
