# INTRODUCTION

- Establishment of ASEAN Risk Assessment Centre for Food Safety (ARAC):
  - Inline with the direction of the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) to establish ASEAN as a single market and production base which lead to the free movement of safe food and achieve the Science-based ASEAN Common Food Safety Measures
  - Initiated by the ASEAN Expert Group on Food Safety (AEGFS) and guided by the Senior Officials Meeting on Health Development (SOMHD)
  - endorsed by the 12<sup>th</sup> ASEAN Health Ministers Meeting (AHMM), September 2014, Hanoi Viet Nam

"We commit to strengthen national food control systems and work together to contribute towards safe and quality food in the ASEAN Community. We recognise risk assessment as an important tool to provide scientific input in developing evidence-based food safety measures, and shall build capacity for integrated ASEAN risk assessment through the ARAC"

## INTRODUCTION

- Establishment of ASEAN Risk Assessment Centre for Food Safety (ARAC):
  - reflected in the Chairman's statement of the 27<sup>th</sup> ASEAN Summit, November 2015, Kuala Lumpur Malaysia
    - "ARAC in Malaysia as an important landmark in the application of an integrated risk assessment mechanism to provide independent scientific input by pooling and utilising scientific expertise across ASEAN in developing evidence-based common food safety measures in ASEAN. This would contribute towards safe and quality food in the ASEAN Community as well as in facilitating food trade within ASEAN
- Hosted by Food Safety and Quality Division, Ministry of Health Malaysia & supported by the ASEAN Regional Integration Support from the EU (ARISE)

# **OBJECTIVES**

- ARAC is to provide independent scientific opinion on food safety issues of common interest in ASEAN including during a food safety crisis to promote adoption of common position/food safety measures and to facilitate trade.
- The functions of ARAC are:
  - Coordinate the implementation of food safety risk assessment in ASEAN by pooling and utilising scientific expertise across ASEAN;
  - Strengthen the capacity on the risk assessment of AMS;
  - Facilitate sharing of information and experiences on risk assessment;
  - Provide a pool of qualified experts on risk assessment; and
  - Coordinate and communicate with relevant ASEAN Sectoral Bodies and collaborative partners.

"ARAC aims to be a regional coordinating centre for independent food safety risk assessment in enhancing the health of the ASEAN Community and facilitate its food trade"


#### **Mission Statement**

"ARAC's mission is to carry out independent food safety risk assessment in a timely and transparent manner utilising available scientific resources"






# **COMPONENT OF ARAC**

Scientific Committee (SC)  Main roles:  review risk assessment request  identify experts required for the Scientific Panel from the ASEAN Risk Assessor directory  review and adopt scientific opinion from the Scientific Panel	Each AMS shall nominate one (1) scientist.
Scientific Panel (SP)  Main roles:  • perform risk assessment and produce scientific opinion for adoption by Scientific Committee  • will only convened when directed by Scientific Committee (on a need basis)	<ul> <li>- AMS shall nominate <u>any number</u> of risk assessors (criteria in the SOP).</li> <li>- Panelist/Members for the Scientific Panel would be taken from the ASEAN Risk Assessor Directory i.e. by the Scientific Committee (on a need basis).</li> </ul>

## Official Launching of ARAC

- Objective
  - to provide a brief orientation of ARAC
  - to increase visibility of ARAC
- Launched by the Honourable Minister of Health Malaysia, 22 March 2016,
   Pullman Hotel, Putrajaya Malaysia.
- Attended by 112 international, regional and local delegates including Secretary General of ASEAN; Deputy Secretary General ASEAN Socio Cultural Community (ASCC); EU Ambassador to ASEAN and; Chair and Vice Chair of ASEAN sectoral bodies.
- Launching was followed by a Panel Discussion entitled "ARAC: Strengthening food safety risk assessment in ASEAN"

# Official Launching of ARAC



## 1<sup>st</sup> Scientific Committee Meeting of ARAC

- b) 1st Scientific Committee Meeting of ARAC
  - Held in ARAC Office, Putrajaya from 23 24 March 2016
  - Attended by 26 participants:
    - 8 Scientific Committee Members (Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam);
    - 3 from the ARAC Secretariat; and
    - 15 observers (Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, ASEAN Secretariat and ARISE)
  - Dr Paul Chiew King Tiong from Singapore and Ms Norrani Eksan from Malaysia was elected as the Chair and Vice-Chair of Scientific Committee for 3 years (2016-2019)
  - The Meeting reviewed and evaluated 3 risk assessment requests submitted:
    - Total Aflatoxins and Aflatoxin B1 through the consumption of peanut and corn, including their products
    - Salmonella spp in Chicken
    - Cyclamates through the consumption of food sweetened with cyclamate

## 1<sup>st</sup> Scientific Panel Meeting of ARAC

- 1st Scientific Panel Meeting of ARAC "Risk Assessment on Total Aflatoxins and Aflatoxin B1 through the Consumption of Peanut and Corn, including their Products"
  - The Meeting was held in ARAC Office, Putrajaya from 26 to 27 October 2016
  - The Meeting was attended by 22 participants:
    - 9 member of the Scientific Panel
    - 3 from the ARAC Secretariats
    - 10 observers from Indonesia, Malaysia, Laos, and ARISE.
  - Ms Kwanyuen Sripaoraya is elected as Chair and Dr Hanifah Nuryani Lioe as Vice Chair of Scientific Panel of ARAC. Dr. Nurul Izzah Ahmad is appointed as Rapporteur
  - The Meeting had discussed on the approach for the risk assessment based on the risk questions, establish work plan and timeline for the completion of the risk assessment tasks and develop format for the risk assessment report or scientific opinion
